This is Council Regulation (EC) No 2201/2003 of the European parliament which has effect from 1<sup>st</sup> March 2005 (the Revised Brussels II Regulation). The Regulation will be applied to cases of parental child abduction within the European Union and to the enforcement of orders for contact cases or access within the European Union.
